The first Alchemy Museum in the United States is being built at Rosicrucian Park in San Jose, California. When completed, it will be the largest museum of its kind in the world and have its own two-story building (shown above) on the beautiful campus across from the world famous Egyptian Museum. It will also have a fully equipped Alchemy Laboratory and auditorium for classes in practical and spiritual alchemy.

The purpose of this museum is to introduce guests to the important role that alchemy plays in the Rosicrucian tradition and to share some of its basic elements, including the history of alchemy, its influence on the sciences, and how its methods are applied in mystical teachings and spiritual transformation.
